Charlotte Rotary members are encouraged to visit the Rotary District 7680 website for the latest opportunities to support our neighbors in Western North Carolina who have been devastated by Hurricane Helene. Your assistance can make a meaningful impact as we work together to help with recovery efforts in the region.

Rotary District 7680 is thrilled to announce matching contributions!

As a result, the Zone is now allowing donors to direct where they want the donation to go. If you wish those donations to go to western North Carolina counties most seriously impacted by Helene, please indicate this in the memo section of your check or in the portion of your credit card donation that says, "Transaction Description". In both cases, saying "Western NC -TS Helene" will ensure it is directed to the most impacted portions of our District 7680 and our sister District, 7670. If you don't care where the money goes, simply leave the memo/transaction description sections blank.

The \$50,000 challenge is still in effect and District 7680 will match every dollar donated in that challenge for a total of \$100,000. We know that money will be used for mid-term and long-term needs in our two districts. Funds already donated to the DAF will be transferred out and applied to the \$50,000 goal for clubs and individuals.


### Rotary Third Thursday at Zio's
